I recommended featuring Richard Fair on the front page of this month's FPC Mishawaka Newsletter, emphasizing the significance of showcasing his experience as he prepares for potential leadership roles as the head of a church in the near future. For those who are not familiar with Richard Fair, let me share a story with you.

Our church has had the privilege of hosting Richard Fair for his Supervised Practice of Ministry (SPM) and Field Education (FE) since mid-January. Richard, a Master of Divinity student at the University of Dubuque Theological Seminary in Iowa, embarked on his ministry internship journey with us to fulfill his seminary credit requirements.

My first encounter with Richard dates back to our joint service on the Admission Commission (AC) for Westminster Presbyterian Church in South Bend during its closure. During the church's closing process, I witnessed Richard's exceptional leadership skills, making it a pleasure and privilege to collaborate with him.

As my family settled into our new home, Richard's willingness to preach at least once a month has alleviated the pressure on me, especially during the busy first three months of the year. Richard's positive impact extends beyond just assisting me; he has contributed significantly to our Christian Education book study. I had the opportunity to witness his well-prepared leadership during one of the sessions, reinforcing my appreciation for his dedication and skills.

As April comes to a close, Richard will be wrapping up his field site education experience. Let's come together in prayer and hope, wishing Richard success in his academic pursuits and the completion of his remaining ordination requirements on his journey towards his calling.

You may have noticed the roof repair work in late January. Strong summer storms with hail were probably responsible for some broken roof tiles over the sanctuary balcony to the east of the bell tower. The ceiling over the balcony showed the problem as plaster began to peel and fall from water damage. Since the damage seemed to be confined to the balcony ceiling, many worshipers weren't 'even aware. It turns out that a lot of local roofs needed repair, and FPC had to wait in line for qualified repair providers. Work finally got going in January, with a quoted price of \$21,700! There was also a fear that there would be so many broken tiles that replacements would need to be ordered, and this type of material has to be custom made. Happily, the "best-case scenario" held, and the final price was as quoted.

The story gets better. FPC has benefited from time to time from the generosity of the Smock Foundation. As stated on the foundation's website, Laura Smock's wish in 1955 was to "help aged Presbyterians in the state of Indiana for such benevolent, charitable, religious, educational or any allied public purposes...that will promote the health, welfare, and happiness of ailing or needy or crippled or blind." As such, the two stair lifts and the two accessible bathrooms at FPC were paid for with donations from the Smock Foundation. Recently, the foundation has expanded somewhat on the original intent, and invited Indiana churches to apply for assistance with worthy projects. The foundation looked favorably on FPC's application and reimbursed us for the full amount.

Thanks be to God, who provides good stewards and sustains their good works far beyond their days!
