NEWS FROM THE MAC

Pantry Director, Sheilia Swinehart reports:

October: Number of households served; 237, Individuals; 884, Monetary donations: \$1,350. Volunteers from The Vineyard Church delivered a large donation of food, from a recent food drive. And the Pantry received a shipment of frozen meat from USDA.

November: on the 19th, Pantry volunteers picked up the food barrel donations from Martin's Food Store. These donations will be a boost for the clients as the Thanksgiving holiday approaches. Posting of Pantry Hours for the holidays was done.

Pantry Volunteers have begun civil rights training as each group gathers on their varied schedule; part of the Pantry's requirements as a non-profit entity.

The Pantry, along with other community groups/churches, will be part of the January 20, 2018 Food Drop sponsored by Granger Community Church. REFLECTIONS ABOUT PASTOR TRAVIS

As the chair of the Personnel Committee, I had the opportunity to meet with Travis several times over the past 2 years. As we drank the obligatory coffee and started with personnel matters, generally it transitioned into personal stories, experience, reflections. It is easy to do with him. He is genuinely interested in the person he is talking to. However, one needs to be prepared after expressing an opinion for a follow-up question: "Why do you think that is so?" or "What might you do about it?" Stretches you a bit.

The Holy Spirit – through Emily – brought his family to Mishawaka. We did meet, at least in part, his needs: a church to serve, an income, and time to spend with his growing boys. Similarly, he met our needs. After a few years of contentiousness and then adjusting to the reality of having a part time staff, our congregation needed a calming, spirit-filled listener. We got that in Travis, along with consistently meaningful sermons.

There has never been a doubt that his time at FPC would be limited, 3 years at the most. Sadly it was only 2. Even so, Travis never came across as a "short timer". He began with one-on-one meetings to get to know the members. He offered opportunities for small group meetings after worship, in the evening at church, and even in his home. Travis also made connections with local pastors and organizations.

Pastor Travis Winckler and 1st Presbyterian Mishawaka fit nicely together. We pray that he and 2nd Presbyterian Saint Louis will be equally blessed. Thank you, Pastor Travis, for two healing years.
