Greetings everyone! I hope everything is well with you in 2024. Since we are still in the early part of the year, I am curious to know how many of you are sticking to your New Year's resolutions so far. Research suggests that approximately 80% of people fail to keep their New Year's resolutions. Many lose their

determination and motivation as early as mid-February, as reported by US News and World Report. I didn't set any New Year's resolutions this time. While I used to do so in the past, my current focus is on lasting

fulfillment rather than a short-term goal. Instead of setting my own specific goals to achieve, I have come to realize the significance of living each day according to what God has planned for me.

Henri Nouwen encourages us to view each day, hour, and minute as a new beginning—a distinct opportunity to transform our lives. He prompts us to imagine living every moment as if it holds the potential for new beginnings, and each day as a collection of promises. Nouwen inspires us to step into the new year with an openness to hear a voice saying, "I have a gift for you, and I can't wait for you to see it." His suggestion is that we embrace the concept of every moment being a chance for renewal and the discovery of gifts in the upcoming year.

I won't discourage anyone from having New Year's resolutions, but it's crucial to bear in mind that each day is a gift from God, intended for us to live to the fullest. To accomplish this, we must open our minds and hearts to the Divine voice, allowing it to guide and inspire us on the journey of realizing each day's fullest potential.

How does the idea of every moment as a chance for renewal align with your personal outlook on life and growth, especially considering the perspective that each day is a gift from God and influences how you approach living life to the fullest?

As we approach the Lenten Season, a six-week period preceding Easter, how do you plan to prepare yourself? This season is observed by Christians worldwide through practices like meditation, almsgiving, and fasting—aiming to live life to the fullest. Yet, if we broaden our perspective beyond Lent, these practices should form the foundation of our entire lives. Our commitment to living with mindfulness, generosity, and self-discipline should persist beyond specific seasons. Again, I want to emphasize that my intention is not to dissuade you from setting any Lenten goals. Rather, I wish to stress that everything we engage in during the Lenten season should become an ongoing practice, extending beyond that specific timeframe of the season. God is always there, reliable and trustworthy in everything. God calls us to show the same consistency in our faith, service, and witness.

Therefore, my beloved, be steadfast, immovable, always excelling in the work of the Lord, because you know that in the Lord your labor is not in vain." 1 Corinthians 15:58

The Lord calls upon each of us to maintain consistency in our faith. Our relationship with the Lord should exhibit unwavering steadiness, avoiding fluctuations and reflecting continual progress in responding to the upward call of God in Christ Jesus. How does knowing that God is always reliable impact your dedication to faith, service, and sharing your beliefs? In staying firm in your faith, how can you thrive in carrying out the Lord's work in your everyday life?

Wishing you a blessed Lenten season filled with reflection, growth, and moments of peace. May your journey bring you closer to your faith and inspire positive changes in your life.


ing finds! I, as well as many other PW ladies and men, generally go home with something they have found. If you know people just starting out or starting over, we have something for them.




Christian Education
