A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR DANIEL

Recently as I was reading our FPC prayer list, one of the Beatitudes Jesus has given us in the sermon on the mountain raced through my mind.

"Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted." Matthew 5:4

I was thinking about what Jesus really meant about "mourning." We all experience losses in life, but our heart sometimes doesn't want to accept them. When someone we love and care is going through such a difficult time in life, we also share his or her pain, hurt feeling and suffering.

Mourning is the natural process we go through in life. There is nothing we should be ashamed of mourning because God has given us an emotional feeling to express both inwardly and outwardly.

Henri Nouwen writes in his book "Turn My Mourning into Dancing" that "[w]e are called to grieve our losses. It seems paradoxical, but healing and dancing begin with looking squarely at what causes us pain."

I remember the grief I felt after my mom was diagnosed with the stomach cancer. It was one of the shocking moments in my life. When I first heard from her doctor that she has a small size of cancer, my mind went completely blank.

I tried to stay strong and bold, but I couldn't hold my emotion. I completely broke down and mourned next to my mother as I was praying for her. I felt sorry for my mother. I even thought that it was my fault that she got cancer. While I was weeping, she gently tapped my back and spoke tenderly, **"It's all right... it's all right."** I felt comforted by her touch and her simple words.

In the book of Isaiah 61:3, the prophet says "[the LORD provides] those who mourn in Zion – to give them a garland instead of ashes, the oil of gladness instead of mourning, the mantle of praise instead of a faint spirit."

In Isaiah's day, ashes are worn on the head as a sign of mourning. When those mourners are comforted, their ashes will be replaced by a garland. At the center of our mourning and grief, we find God's comfort and peace.

Don't run away from you mourning, but embrace it for there is a blessing hidden in it. God is aware and knows of every tear we cry, and he will turn our mourning into dancing.

Jesus said, **"Blessed are you who weep now, for you will laugh."** (Luke 6:21b)

Baby Bundle Update

We have a joy and a concern for our Baby Bundle mission. First, we would like to thank everyone who has contributed to the Baby Bundles in the past. It really helps with our expenses. Finding blankets, onesies, and outfits in the bassinet in the CE lobby is wonderful!

Our concern is that two of our major sources of items, The Salvation Army and St. Vincent de Paul, no longer are open for shopping. That leaves Goodwill on the 50% off days. If you would like to help with this mission, there are a couple of places that offer beautiful items. One is Kid's Konsignment at Town and Country Mall and Once Upon a Child at Indian Ridge. We can't purchase many things there because they are more than one dollar. That is what we can afford to spend on items for the Baby Bundles. We keep the cost at \$4.00 per bundle. However, if you want to purchase a couple of items and donate them, that would certainly help. We need newborn size for the onesies and outfits. Preemie outfits are the most difficult to find, and usually, the most expensive. Garage sales are also a good option, but you have to be very careful that the items are in good condition....absolutely no stains and snaps that work.

The MAC FOOD PANTRY at Albright UMC continues to serve the community as much as possible during these difficult times. Panty hours have remained Tuesday evenings and Friday mornings. The volunteers and clients adapted to the necessary process due to the coronavirus.

The Pantry Director reported the statistics for July: families served: 96 families; 333 individuals. USDA items and donations of food; money; fresh produce from individual gardens; bottles of hand sanitizer from a Boy Scout troop; and free milk are examples.

BLASTS FROM THE PAST

Perusing through a wonderful cookbook from 1947 put together by the Women's Service Guild of the church, I found several interesting facts.

First of all, it seems that back in those days, the only spices regularly used were salt, pepper and in rare instances, paprika. Comparing this to the endless selection available for modern day cooking, it's no wonder the recipes were easy to make then.

An apparent favorite of that era was ham loaf. I found no less than 11 different recipes for this item. One recipe contained an incredible 10 ingredients while the rest ranged from four to seven. I certainly would have fit right in cooking back in the days of old since I cringe at a recipe of double-digit ingredients! The favorite cooking technique seems to have been making anything that could be shaped into a loaf, as I also found another ten recipes for various other loaves using different meats or fish.
