#### A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR DANIEL

Christ is Risen! He is Risen Indeed! Death has been beaten. The grave has been conquered.

Three days after Jesus' burial, three women, Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, and Salome, went to Jesus' tomb very early on the first day of the week. When they arrived, they discovered "that the stone was rolled back."

As they entered the tomb, they saw a young man, dressed in a white robe, sitting on the right side; and they were alarmed. But he said to them, "Do not be alarmed; you are looking for Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He has been raised; he is not here. Look, there is the place they laid him." Mark 16:5-7

Even though Jesus told them to expect his resurrection prior to his death, they were still astounded at what the angel had told them. They did not yet understand the mystery. The young man instructed them to tell the disciples that Jesus had risen from the grave and would meet them in Galilee.

However, those three women fled from the tomb because they were in great fear and said nothing to anyone according to Gospel Mark. And, this is likely **the original ending** of Mark's Gospel (16:1-8). \*Note: Although there are two versions of ending "Shorter and Longer" after Mark 16:8, most scholars view Mark 16:9-20 was a later addition to the original ending.

The ending of Mark cuts off abruptly, with the only witnesses to the resurrection afraid and saying nothing to anyone. It is quite strange and unsatisfying. Maybe, Mark intentionally left the story unfinished for readers to think and decide how the story should come out. This means that readers must put themselves into the narrative and ask a question "What would I do?"

If we are uncertain about what the empty tomb means like the women in the narrative, can we say that we believe in Christ's resurrection? Too many things are left unresolved toward to the end of gospel Mark, but one thing that the gospel clearly testified readers that the tomb was empty. Jesus' promise of his resurrection was finally fulfilled on Easter Sunday.

"Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O Death, in your sting?" The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. But thanks be to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ. 1 Corinthians 15:55-57

Easter is the greatest day in all of history. Jesus' resurrection changes everything. It changes our sorrow into joy, despair into hope and fear into love. Our life had no hope of eternal happiness before Christ conquered death and redeemed us. However, on Easter Sunday morning, God has raised his Son Jesus from the dead to prove his love for us. That's why we can tell everyone, "Happy Easter!"

Jesus conquered death. We have nothing to fear! Christ is risen! He is risen indeed!
