## A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR DANIEL

What words to describe my dad? I would describe my dad as “Sweet, Gentle and Loving” person. Sometimes, my dad does something really off the wall (almost every man does), but he is a loving and supportive husband, father, and grandfather.

I still remember and miss my daddy’s big hug and kiss when I used to live with him (even after my marriage with Jae). When my dad was about to leave the house for work in the morning, he always gave me a big hug with kiss on my cheek. He still does it, and I never feel uncomfortable with it because I know it is his way of expressing his love for me.

In Korean culture, this would be unthinkable behavior among guys even today. He is a bit of different from other Korean men in his generation.

He always carries small toys or accessories in his suit pocket and enjoys handing out them to little kids in his church. One Sunday, I heard kids calling my dad “Toy Man” and saw them looking for him all over the place. This really brought a smile on my face and became a memorable story of my dad that I would like to share with anyone today.

I never felt embarrassed about my dad, but very proud of him.

Since we moved to the US, he has been the backbone of my family (he still is and will be). Until my dad became a full-time Metro Bus Driver in Seattle, he worked in several different fields. He worked as an office worker, construction worker, hotel restaurant server, and store stocker.

He used to have a permanent office job for the first three years, but he handed over his position to his younger brother in Korea because the company could sponsor an immigrant for my uncle’s family. My mom was a bit concerned about our family’s future once my dad made his decision to leave the company he worked for, but my dad never worried about it.

Instead, he searched and tried different kinds of jobs that he could do to support and take care of his family. He sacrificed so much for me and my brother to give us a better life here in the US. We never grew up feeling we were in need or lacking because of my dad who worked very hard all his life to support our education, our marriage and our better life.

The love and compassion that he has poured out for his family is immeasurable, and I am so blessed and thankful to have him as my dad.

Psalms 103:13, the psalmist says, “**As a father has compassion on his children, so the LORD has compassion on those who fear him.**” While it is a matter to show our deep reverence for the LORD, it is a Father’s compassion and his sacrificial love that sustain us, not our efforts at reverence.

We all have one father who created us and first loved us. Our Father in heaven is a compassionate and gracious God, slow to anger and rich in love. How blessed we are to have a father like him in our lives!

As Father’s Day is approaching this month, I would like to honor and thank all fathers in our community and say, “**Happy Father’s Day!**”

I heard mom said she had a very long and difficult labor when I was born, so I had to be hospitalized for couple days. Mom still remembers sobbing and crying because of the thought that I was born sick. She also said she was terrified to take a baby's first bath. She wanted to ask for help from the neighbor, but she didn't have a courage to ask for it. She had an uneasy life when she was in her 20's and 30's due to unstable finance, long distance from her hometown and family, and unsupportive husband (which was very common back in days). Despite of all her struggles raising me, she made me who I am today. I felt very grateful that she was persistent raising two beautiful daughters with good minds. She believes that everything was possible because she believes in God. In Deuteronomy 28:1, "If you fully obey the LORD your God and carefully follow all his commands I give you today, the LORD your God will set you high above all the nations on earth (NIV)." I think the verse reflects on what my mom did to show me as an exemplary Christian. I am hoping to live like her to show the same faith to my soon-to-be-born daughter.
