As we continue through this Lenten season, we are reminded that it is a time for reflection and preparation. Although the journey to Easter can feel long and slow, it is also a time for deep change and growth, leading us to the joy of Christ's resurrection in just a few weeks.

As we think about this season, it is a good time to ask ourselves: Why did Jesus come? Why did he suffer so much? Why did he have to die on the cross? The answer is simple—Jesus' sacrifice was all because of his great love for us. He took on the weight of our sins and suffered, not for any worldly reason, but to bring us back to God. Jesus' sacrifice on the cross was the greatest act of love, showing us that God's love is stronger than death, greater that sin, and more powerful than anything we face in life. We often hear the phrase "love wins", and while it is hopeful, it holds an even deeper truth when we think about Jesus' sacrifice. His selfless sacrifice was not a defeat, but the ultimate victory. Not matter what we face, love is always greater. "Love wins" means that God's love is the final word. It is a power that never fails, heals, and restores. Even in our darkest moments, we can remember that love has already won. In every hard time, we can trust that God's love will help us through—it never ends, never gives up, and always wins.



In just a few weeks, we will enter Passion Week, a time to remember Jesus' journey to the cross. Each step he took led to victory. While Passion Week may feel like a time of quiet reflection, it is important to remember that it is not just about silence or sadness. It leads us through darkness into the light of Easter, where we find hope and celebrate Christ's victory over death though his resurrection. As you continue your Lenten journey, I encourage you to take heart and hold on to hope. Even when the path feels difficult, remember that Christ is with you every step of the way. The light of Easter is near, bringing the promise of new life, victory, and healing. Keep moving forward, for the resurrection is our ultimate hope, and it shows us that love will always win.


