In June, Gabie got baptized, and I did my first baptism service at First Presbyterian Church. It was a unique experience for me because I had the privilege to both see my daughter being baptized and to baptize Jack McCloskey in the presence of our congregation. In our Reformed Tradition, baptism is a sign and seal of God's gift of salvation, and we Presbyterians have recognized it as one of two sacraments initiated by Christ in Scripture. In baptism, we believe and confess that God claims us as his own children, and members of Christ's body, the church. In our tradition, we practice both adult and infant baptism. It's our great privilege to administer that sacrament of baptism in the public worship, especially infant baptism. We baptize infants, not out of tradition, but because we believe that they are covenant children of God and should receive the sign of the covenant. This is what it says about infant baptism on our PCUSA website: Infant baptism expresses that it is God who chooses us for faith, discipleship, and salvation. Yes it is God who chooses us, no one else, including ourselves. God chooses us. What does this mean? Remember what Moses' mother, Jochebed (her name is first mentioned in Exodus 6:20) did for Moses after giving birth? The Israelites had so increased in number and in power that the Pharaoh thought they would be a threat in time of war, so he decided to make slaves of the people and to destroy every male child and thus eventually wipe out the Hebrew race. In the middle of this great terror, Jochebed gave birth to a fine baby boy and immediately hid him for three months. When Jochebed could no longer hide her baby safely, she took a basket of reeds and coated it with tar to make it waterproof. Then she wrapped up her baby tightly, put him in the basket, and placed it among the reeds on the bank of the river. The baby's sister, Miriam, stood at a distance to see what would happen to him.

Have you ever imagined how his mother felt when she had to set her baby afloat on the Nile River? Jochebed released her baby to the uncertain currents of the Nile, toward an unknown destination. What does Jochebed's action tell us? According to Hebrews 11:23, it is written: "It was by faith that Moses' parents hid him for three months when he was born. They saw that God had given them an unusual child, and that they were not afraid to disobey the king's command." (NLT)

Jochebed didn't know what would happen to Moses, but she released control from her hands and entrusted God with his life. That is faith. Since I cannot always be with Gabie, what is the best thing I can do for her as a parent? Like Jochebed, I release my control over Gabie's life and entrust her into the hands of God, who has called and chosen her.

Infant baptism encourages us and our children to trust God by symbolizing God's promises that He will always be with them, comfort them, help them, guide them, and love them forever. In what ways can you practice your trust and faith in God, even though it means having to go against the current? How can we live faithfully in such a sustained environment of chaos and crisis today? Remember, God is in complete control. He will come and save you. He will guide your ways. He will work through you. He will come and deliver you.
