I can't believe we are in the last month of the year—"December". What comes to your mind when you hear the word December? It goes without saying that I think of Christmas. Every year the holiday season comes, many people find themselves busy with Christmas preparations—gifts, meals, baking, cards, and decorating.

However, we must not let our busyness distract our focus on celebrating the birth of our Savior, Jesus Christ—the true meaning of Christmas.

"The Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory" (John 1:14). The Word "logos", became flesh when Jesus was born as a baby in the manger at Bethlehem. Christ had always existed as the Son of God— "in the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God" (John 1:1), but now chose to come into the world in human flesh and dwelt among us.

When the light is present, everything is changed. When Christ, the light, lives and dwells among us, we are changed. We have eternal life. Jesus said, "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life" (John 3:16).

God lit up the world with love through his Son, Jesus.

We are hoping to sell more of the Christmas items for last minute shoppers.

The work room has been cleared and reorganized. We are planning to continue that work, with a day in January, dedicated to sorting clothes.

Once again we thank those that continue to bring us items to sell. We ask again, that these items are clean and spot/animal hair free. When donating small appliances or electronics, make sure they work and all the parts are there. Our 2023 schedule is out, but the committee is having a discussion on scheduling more pop-up sales on non-scheduled months with fewer hours.

The money we make goes to various organizations like Presbyterian Disaster Agency. If you hear of any national disaster, you know PDA is there.

PDA is the emergency and refugee program of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). The core budget, including staff and administrative costs, is funded through the One Great Hour of Sharing, and its program work is additionally funded through designated gifts.
