Since I haven't had any chance to say "best wishes for year 2020" yet in a newsletter, let me begin my pastoral letter with this special greeting to you:

"May You and Your family receive many blessings from the Lord in year 2020!"

In the Bible, blessing means receiving God's gift or favor. When God called Abram (*before God renamed him to Abraham*) to leave his father's house to go to the land that God would show him, God promised to Abram that He would make him a great nation and bless him and make his name great.

Why did God make that promise with Abram?

What was God's purpose for blessing Abram's life?

The answer is simple. God blessed Abram so he could be a blessing to others. However, in order to be a blessing to others, Abram must submit himself to the divine call. He must leave his homeland, for the worship of the Lord, in the land of promise. Only Abram's obedience to the divine call would bring blessing on him and to others.

In year 2020, I hope and pray that God blesses each one of you abundantly so that you can be a blessing to others. All the blessings we have received come from God, and they should continue to flow through us.

Then, how can we be a blessing to others?

Remember, what Abram did when God called him, and this is what the author of Hebrews writes, "**By faith Abraham obeyed when he was called to go out to a place where he was to receive as an inheritance.**" (Heb. 11:8) Abram responded to God's command with action. He simply obeyed God's promise.

God blesses us because he loves us. Now, God calls us to share the blessings that we have received from him.

Let me end my pastoral letter with "The Priestly Benediction" from Numbers 6:22-26

"The LORD bless you and keep you; the LORD make his face to shine upon you, and be gracious to you; the LORD lift up his countenance upon you, and give you peace."

BUILD AND STRENGTHEN THE SPIDER WEB

Every year, after Thanksgiving and before Mexico’s Guadalupe Day (December 12), Victor, Felipe, and I drive from village to village to meet with our cistern owner partners. This year, these visits are between December 1-11. Hundreds of men and women from a couple dozen villages will have the chance to tell us about the state of their rainwater catchment systems, and to pay back a portion of what they owe for the building materials. Not only cistern owners attend these gatherings. Families without cisterns often come to ask how to join this movement. We meet in churches, town halls, basketball courts, streets, and front yards. We do business at tables, benches, and the hood of my car. Flashlights required. The December visits add new strands to and reinforce the existing fibers of our partnership web.

OUR MEXICAN PARTNERS

Victor, Raul, Isaias, Felipe, Diego, Lucas, Ezequias, and Esau build cisterns. Their hard work, skill, kindness, and patience wins the respect of those with whom they serve. Pati, Rosa, Teresa, Margarita, and Encarnacion nourish our guests and treat them with loving care. Felipe Torres oversees everything, accounts for everything, and fills the gaps to keep this whole kit and caboodle moving forward. The cistern owner families—old and new—do their jobs, as well. May they never stop looking for God in their lives. May their Lord’s unfailing love always motivate them to help others. We thank them and their families.

Past, present, and future. To name them would require many pages. Thank God for their steadfast participation. How wonderful it is when the Father chooses to work through his adopted children. May we continue to choose to serve our neighbors in need—including those in Mexico.

They are always looking for volunteers – they are open Tuesday night 6-7:30 and Fridays 10-noon. Staple items include cereal, peanut butter, soups, vegetables, rice, pasta, meats (canned and packaged) and toiletries. They also have someone available to help with gas cards and utility bills. The Pantry is located in Albright Church 504 W. Mishawaka Ave. Mishawaka, Indiana

The Mishawaka Food Pantry, located at 315 Lincolnway West. In addition to food they provide, clothing, hot lunches, family development, toiletries, transportation solutions, and most importantly, a sense of community. The Pantry provides a space for individuals with similar stories and experiences to come together in our cafe that serves free lunches Tuesdays through Thursdays. The Pantry is committed to providing a caring and friendly atmosphere that will leave our clients feeling more confident, hopeful, and empowered.
