First, I will begin with "Happy New Year FPC family and friends! May this year, 2023, be an incredible part of your journey!

It's a new year and a new beginning. As we start a new year, it is natural to set new year's resolutions. What are your resolutions this year? Making resolutions is easy, but keeping them is hard. Why is it so hard to stick to them? It can be lack of time, lack of resources, lack of motivation, or loss of interest after starting. However, the most common reason we fail is that we easily give in to temptation.

After Jesus' baptism, the Spirit of God led Jesus into the wilderness. For forty days and forty nights, Jesus fasted, prayed, and offered his whole life to God. By the end of those forty days and nights, he was famished and the tempter came and said to him,

"If you are the Son of God, command these stones to become loaves of bread." But, Jesus answered him, using the book of Deuteronomy,

"It is written, one does not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes from the mouth of God." (Deuteronomy 8:3)

"By every word". In Deuteronomy 8:3, this refers to God's word of direction in the wilderness and God's provision of manna. The Son of God will not abandon or betray his trust in God to provide for him. After the first temptation, Satan tries to tempt Jesus two more times. But Jesus replies to each of Satan's temptations with reference to Scripture (Deuteronomy 6:16 for the second temptation, and Deuteronomy 6:13 for the third temptation). When Jesus was asked to prove his power and authority as the Son of God, he chose to obey God and live by God's Word.

We give in to temptation because we lose our focus. The key to overcoming temptation is not to resist, but to change our focus. It begins with having our eyes fixed on godly direction. How can the strength Jesus exhibits and the words he speaks against all temptations help you to focus on the things that matter most in life?

This year, the season of Lent begins with Ash Wednesday on February 22nd. It's the 40-day period of repentance and renewal preceding Easter. We may consider Lent as "A Spiritual New Year". As the season approaches, people set goals for what to give up and do for Lent.

How are you going to observe Lent in your own life this year? What would you like to do this Lent to make it more meaningful for you and your family? Lent is a time for us to reflect and focus on what it means to be people of God and be Christians in the context of the lives God has given us. This is a journey that moves us toward the cross.

So, set your hearts and minds on things above, not on earthly things. Keep your focus on the cross of Christ, and on Jesus, the Incarnate Word, during this Lenten season.


