It's a humbling experience to realize that what I am doing for my daughter right now doesn't come close to matching the sacrifices and hard work my mother put in for me. I always understood that a mother's love is selfless and steadfast, but, it was not until I had a child of my own that I fully appreciated my mother's compassion and devotion to raising me.

FROM THE SESSION:

Daniel was hired by the Session in 2019 as a covenant pastor. By doing so we did not have to form a Pastor Nomination Committee (PNC) or do all the steps that have to be followed by forming a PNC. As a covenant pastor Daniel was given a 3-year contract which was renewed at the end of that time.

Both the Session and Daniel feel that it is time to hire him as a Called and Installed Pastor. In order to do so we would have to form a PNC and do a full and open search OR ask Presbytery for a designated pastorate, which is elected by the congregation, but does not require a PNC. Session sent a request that Daniel become a "Designated Pastor" and this has been approved by the Presbytery. We will hold a congregational meeting on May 7 to vote on this and at our 2024 Annual Meeting, we will vote to remove the designated title, which leaves Daniel as our installed pastor.

Pentecost Offering




FIRST, **THANK YOU**, we have been so very blessed with all the prayer shawls that have been made.
