

Dear Beloved FPC Mishawaka church family and friends,

When I think of the month of May, one word comes to mind: *family*. May is often referred to as "Family Month", and for a good reason. At the heart of this month is **Mother's Day**, which we celebrate every year on the **second Sunday of May**—this year, falling on **May 11th**. It is a remarkable day, one that gives us a special opportunity to honor the women who have poured out their lives for their children and families. Mothers embody sacrifice in so many unseen ways—through patience, love, and relentless care. We thank God for them. Whether your mother is still with you or has already gone to be with the Lord, may this day be a time of gratitude, remembrance, and blessing. For those who are mothers now, may you feel seen, honored, and deeply appreciated.

Yet while May centers on mothers, I also want to take a moment to reflect on the role of **fathers**. Traditionally, we wait until June to celebrate Father's Day. But when we speak of *family*, both mothers and fathers are part of God's beautiful design. Sometimes society overlooks the father's role—perhaps because some fathers have been absent, uninvolved, or have not modeled the strength and love that fatherhood calls for. But that is not the whole story. A father's presence in the family is not only necessary—it is *precious*. When a father loves his children and leads his home with grace, humility, and integrity, it leaves a mark that shapes generations. So even though May is not "**Father's Month**", I believe we can and should honor both mothers and fathers as we reflect on what it means to be family.

I once heard someone say that *family* stands for "*Father And Mother, I Love You*". Though it may sound simple, it captures a deep truth—family begins with love. It is about honoring both parents, cherishing their presence, and showing them the love and respect they deserve. This reminds us of God's commandment in Exodus 20:12

"Honor your father and mother, so that your days may be long in the land that the Lord your God is giving you."

This command is not just for children. It is a calling for all of us—to remember, to give thanks, and to show honor to the ones who raised us, guided us, and loved us. And for those whose parents have passed, may this month be a time of reflection. Many of us find that family gatherings often happen *because* of our parents—their presence brings people together, their love holds us in unity. If you are now in the role of parent, your love and presence matter more than you know. You are shaping the next generation with your faith, your words, and your example.


As we go through this month of May, let us cherish our families. Let us honor our mothers and fathers—not just on special days, but with lives that reflect the love they have given us.
