A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR DANIEL

There are four special days for us to remember and celebrate in November: "All Saints' Day", "Saint Andrew's Day", "Thanksgiving Day" and "1st Sunday of Advent".

In our FPC Mishawaka tradition, we call the names of those saints "Our loved Ones" lost in the previous year and ring the bell of remembrance as a way of thanking and honoring their faithful life and service on earth. We also keep this day by praying that someday we may be counted among those saints who have gone before us on the Day of the Lord.

On St. Andrews Day, we celebrate this Sunday with special readings "Scottish Psalter: Psalm 23" & "Scottish Benediction" and bagpipe music. When Len plays "Amazing Grace", the mournful wail of the bagpipes gives me chills and fills my hearts with tears and thanksgiving for God's abundant grace. The reading of Psalm 23 always reminds me of the care and protection of my Lord, who is Good Shepherd for all people, and the words of the Scottish Benediction enlightens my heart and fills me with hope.

November is the month of Gratitude. This is the month that we can examine our life more closely, and reflect on God's blessing in our lives, and express our gratitude for the things that God has done for us. What are you grateful for this coming Thanksgiving? Jae and I deeply thankful to the Lord for giving us our first child "Gabie", and the blessings that we have received from our church family and friends. I still wonder what if I haven't gotten called from First Presbyterian Church Mishawaka about two and half years ago, would this ever be happened to my family? I would like to call this "Miracle".

Every birth is a miracle of God. But the most miraculous birth in our history is Jesus who came to bring hope and redemption to all people. As we begin to prepare our hearts to celebrate the First Sunday of Advent (Nov. 28th), it gives us an opportunity to reflect and meditate our thoughts on hope. More than 2000 years ago, Christ entered into this broken world to give us hope. Yes, we have hope beyond this life because Christ has opened the door of eternal life for us through his death and resurrection. Christ is the foundation of our hope.

As we observe and celebrate from All Saints' Day to the First Sunday of Advent, may our hearts be filled with the blessings of grace, gratitude and hope in the month of November.
