

"Pray in the Spirit at all times in every prayer and supplication. To that end keep alert and always persevere in supplication for all the saints." - Ephesians 6:18

The Apostle, Paul, provides three key principles for establishing a strong foundation in our prayer lives: relying on the guidance of the Holy Spirit, engaging in various types of prayer, and showing unwavering dedication to praying for fellow believers. For Paul, it's important to pray because it helps counter and weaken the forces of darkness. As he mentions in the previous verse (Ephesians 6:12), our struggle is **not against enemies of blood and flesh** but against spiritual powers of evil in the heavenly places.

How does our understanding that our struggle is against spiritual forces impact our perspective on prayer and the importance of praying for fellow believers?

In life, there are many things we can't control, such as unexpected illness or the unpredictability of severe weather. These situations can often catch us off guard, highlighting the unpredictable nature of life. When seeking a job, our efforts matter, but being hired depends on factors like job availability and qualifications.

As we navigate life's twists and turns, it becomes evident that what we expect is not always what we receive. This reality invites us to pause and contemplate the profound role of prayer in these moments of unpredictability.

Rabbi Abraham Joshua Heschel (1907-1972) quotes:

"Prayer is our attachment of the utmost. Without God in sight, we are like the scattered rungs of a broken ladder. To pray is to become a ladder on which thoughts mount to God; to join the movement toward Him which surges unnoticed throughout the entire universe. We do not step out of the world when we pray; we merely see the world in a different setting...In prayer we shift the center of living from self-consciousness to self-surrender. God is the center toward which all forces tend. He is the source, and we are the flowing of His force, the ebb and flow of His tides."


How can we personally deepen our connection with God through prayer, shifting our focus from self-consciousness to self-surrender?

Entrusting ourselves to God through prayer is the ultimate expression of faith, demonstrating our complete reliance on the guidance of the Holy Spirit.

"Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus." - Philippians 4:6-7

How does the practice of bringing all our concerns to God in prayer impact our daily lives and the way we handle challenges? Can we envision a life where prayer and supplication become our natural response to life's ups and downs, leading to a deep and abiding sense of peace?

A list of dates and times can be found on the church bulletin board. If you find yourself free, you are welcome to join us.


Dedication Sunday—October 15th



*Nothing perishable and please watch for expiration dates.


