I found myself able to talk endlessly about the meaningful work we're doing, and it was a blessing to be able to reflect on all that has happened.



As your pastor, I understand that you may have questions or concerns about my leadership or the church itself, and that's completely natural. However, despite our weaknesses and flaws, God works through us to show His love to others.

It's important to remember that, even in our imperfections, we are instruments of God's grace. God often uses our shortcomings as opportunities to demonstrate His strength, reminding us that His love can shine through us in unexpected ways. It's easy to think that the size of a church affects the significance of what we share, but I want to remind our church that, as 2 Corinthians 12:9-10 tells us, this is not the case. Paul writes:

"My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness."

God's grace is always enough. What truly matters is how we allow Christ's power to be evident through our weaknesses and challenges. Paul also says:





Paul shows us God's work and love can be powerfully revealed through us, regardless of our church's size. Whether we are facing challenges or celebrating successes, God's love and strength are always with us. I encourage each of you to embrace the ways in which God is working through our community, and to continue supporting one another with faith and compassion.

Thank you for being an important part of our church family and community. Let us continue to share the message of God's grace and love, trusting that His power is made perfect in our weakness. I look forward to seeing how God will use us for His purposes in the seasons ahead.


Peace & Global Witness Offering—October 6th
