"The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has come near, repent, and believe in the good news." Mark 1:15.

Jesus' first message of the Gospel in Mark is "**The time is fulfilled**". The Greek word "time" is *kairos*. This is not simply chronological time, but decisive time for God's action. Jesus spoke this message in public after John was arrested. This shows that God just stepped into our human history in a unique and decisive way. The time of John the Baptist was over; the time of Jesus, the fulfillment of God's promise, had finally come: **The time is fulfilled**.

"Kairos" is God's timing - one not marked by the past, the present or the future. *Kairos* is the time of experiencing God's love and his salvation for the world. God offers us *Kairos* time. Henri Nouwen writes in his book *"Turning My Mourning into Dancing"*:

Time has to be converted, from *chronos*, mere chronological time, to *kairos*, a New Testament Greek word that has to do with opportunity, with moments that seem ripe for their intended purpose.

Then, even while life continues to seem harried, while it continues to have hard moments, we say, "Something good is happening amid all this." We get glimpses of how God might be working out his purposes in our days. Time becomes not just something to get through or manipulate or manage, but the arena of God's work with us.

Whatever happens – good things or bad, pleasant or problematic – we look and ask, "What might God be doing here?" We see the events of the day as continuing occasions to change the heart. Time points to Another and begins to speak to us of God.

We are part of God's timing "*kairos*". Our times are in God's hands. Our lives belong fully and finally to the One who created us. God's timing is perfect, and he has the final say. Surely, waiting on God's timing can be hard, but we must wait patiently and prayerfully.

Before Jesus began his public ministry, he had to wait. He had to wait on his Father's timing. We are called to wait on God's timing. Waiting does not diminish us. It is not wasted time. Rather, it is necessary for our emotional and spiritual growth. The longer we wait, the more we will learn about him and his plan for us.

"Be still before the LORD, and wait patiently for him!" -Psalm 37:7a-

At the *kairos* time, <u>God will fulfill his promises to us.</u> God's timing is perfect. Trust God and his timing! Blessings, Pastor Daniel
