A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR DANIEL

First of all, Jae and I want to say thank you to our FPC family and friends celebrating together for the gender reveal event of our baby on Easter Sunday. It's official. It's a girl. I was a bit surprised with the result when I saw pink color confetti drop on the table after I popped up the gender reveal balloon. I was expecting a boy because most of my cousins from both side of my parents are male dominated group. So, I told others that I would be surprised if it's a girl, and it came out very surprising.

However, the baby's gender is no surprise to God because even before the foundation of the world God already hand-picked us to be the mother and father of this girl. Jae and I believe that God chose this little girl for us because there were no better people for the job to raise her. As a parent, we will take our responsibility to raise this child in love and faith.

The psalmist writes in Psalm 78:1-4, "Listen, dear friends, to God's truth, bend your ears to what I tell you. I'm chewing on the morsel of a proverb; I'll let you in on the sweet old truths, stories we heard from our fathers, counsel we learned at our mother's knee. We're not keeping this to ourselves, we're passing it along to the next generation – God's fame and fortune, the marvelous things he has done." (The Message version)

There are all kinds of stories, counsel, and instruction we can find in the Old and New Testament. And, it's a wonderful privilege and opportunity for parents to share God's Word and his plan with their children and the generation to come.

The apostle Paul wrote a letter to his young protegee Timothy how he has been taught from infancy to grow in his sincere faith by his grandmother Lois and his mother Eunice. Timothy didn't arrive at his faith as an adult through his own will or power. Rather, his mother and grandmother nurtured him with the Holy Scripture to help and prepare Timothy to grow his faith in Christ Jesus.

One important spiritual ministries is parenting – fostering faith in our children.

A spiritual legacy doesn't guarantee we'll come to faith, but the example and mentoring of others can prepare the way. It's the parents' duty and responsibility to nurture and raise their children in faith so that they can bless others when they grow up.

And, I believe that the church is the same. Each one of us in the body of Christ is called to encourage and nurture others. We may minister to others through being in regular prayer for them, teaching or leading a book study, visiting and spending time with someone who is lonely and sick, or even offering free tutoring for kids who need extra help in our community.

How might we be an encouraging presence in another person's life today? Who should we serve today for Christ?

In all our relationship, may we seek wisdom and guidance from our God to be wise leaders, parents, and friends to all people.
