From Pastor Daniel Cho,

It's early to say this greeting, but I want to say "Happy Thanksgiving!" I am truly thankful for all your support, prayer, encouragement and love that you have shown me.

November, "The Month of Gratitude" has finally arrived. This is the month that we can look back on the year 2019 and reflect on what we are thankful for. What are you thankful for this year?

In Ephesians 5:20, believers are called to "give thanks to God the Father at all times and for everything in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ." Here, Paul tells all believers to give thanks to God at all times. He also mentions the same message in 1 Thessalonians 5:18a, "give thanks in all circumstances".

In ancient religions, offering thanksgiving to the deities was common practice for those who received favors. The deities were considered to be the supreme benefactors of humanity, and one who received favors usually returned thanks with the hope of receiving further blessing in the future.

However, the apostle encourages the believers to offer thanks to God in all circumstances and at all times.

Then, how are the believers to be thankful for trials and tribulations?

Jesus on the night of his arrest, took bread, gave thanks and broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying, "Take and eat; this is my body." Then he took the cup, gave thanks and gave it to his disciples, saying "Drink it; this is my blood."

On the last meal with his disciples, Jesus knew his hour "the beginning of great tribulation" had come. However, even in the midst of troubles Jesus gave thanks to his Father in heaven.

Thanks on the night of his arrest and coming trials?

Jesus gave thanks because he had confidence that God's will was being fulfilled through his suffering and death on the cross. Jesus knew that his Father would raise him from the grave to fulfill his will.

Why should we give thanks to God in all circumstances? Because "it is God's will in Christ Jesus for us" (1 Thessalonians 5:18b). God does not promise us that we will have good health, successful careers, or earthly riches. God does something better than these things for us: he gives us his one and only Son Jesus to be our Savior and in his Word he promises us eternal life.

By believing in God's will in Christ, we should be always thankful to God in all circumstances.

May God's blessings of love, peace and joy fill your life this November!
