A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR DANIEL

Greeting to our First Presbyterian Church Mishawaka family and friends. It is my pleasure to announce that our daughter "Gabie" was born on September 13th, 2021. Jae and I have been waiting for this day for months, and our hearts were filled with joy and gratitude as we welcomed our little one.

Gabie was 6 pounds 14 ounces and 20 inches long at birth. When I hold Gabie and looked in her eyes for the first time, I felt a strong desire to care for and protect her. Every time I pick up Gabie for changing her diaper, burping, swaddling, carrying, playing and sleeping, I feel like I am holding the most precious treasure in the world.

One evening, as I looked into my daughter's eyes, one of the Scripture readings from Psalms came into my mind.

"The LORD is your keeper; the Lord is your shade at your right hand. Then sun shall not strike you by day, nor the moon by night." Psalm 121:5-6

This psalm reminds us that we are always held in God's presence regardless of our awareness. Do we have full confidence and trust that God is our keeper who is always near and watching over us?

The message of this psalm is so comforting to know that no matter what struggles and challenges we may face in life, the LORD will watch over us and be our shade at our right hand. **Shade** is usually a positive image of protection in the OT Scripture. In the harsh climate of the ancient Near East, a shade gives protection from burning heat.

If you remember from the story of Exodus, the LORD kept his people Israel in the wilderness by a pillar of cloud by day, so that they could survive in the excessive heat of the sun. The LORD was their keeper.

As I was holding Gabie and watching over her sleep, I was thinking about God who holds me and watches over me day and night. No matter what kind of situations we may face or go through in life, God constantly holds our hand and keeps his eyes on us. Our God never sleeps or slumbers. He watches over our coming and going both now and forevermore.

So, why not keep our eyes on God - our ultimate source of help?

"I lift up my eyes to the hills – from where will my help come? My help comes from the LORD, who made heaven and earth." Psalm 121:1-2
