A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR DANIEL

As we are entering into the final quarter of the year 2020, may the peace of Christ be with you always.

Last September 6th, our church secretary Nancy reminded us about the "Suggestion Box" in the Sunday Insert. Again, thanks to Chuck for installing it before we stopped having live service around mid-March.

I think it was late August during a weekday morning. When our church staff was coming back to the office after seeing our new digital church sign, we saw a small twofold paper in the suggestion box.

We opened the box for the first time and read what it was written in the paper. It was a suggestion for a "Men's Bible Study". I really like the suggestion and want to get started it.

But before getting started the Bible study for men, it is necessary for men in our church to get together and select a purpose: "Why we need to do this Bible study". Without setting and knowing a clear purpose of the Bible study, this can quickly turn into social gathering. VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

In this time of great need, we are seeking volunteers in groups of fewer than 15 people. Times needed are Monday-Friday 8am-4:30pm, and Wednesdays and Thursday 8am-5:30pm. We have several ongoing projects suitable for one-time or reoccurring volunteers:

- Our pantry is open Monday and Friday from 9am-2pm, and Wednesdays from 11am-5pm. In this role, you may be checking in clients, packing boxes, or carrying boxes to clients' cars.
- Every Thursday from 2:30-5:30pm we host a bonus mobile distribution at our South Bend location. This is a contactless, drive-through distribution where clients are given prepackaged food.
- Every weekday, volunteers may assist with sorting food items, and packing boxes for our Food 4 Kids and Senior Nutrition programs.
- Every weekday during operating hours, volunteers may assist with cleaning the warehouse.
- Volunteers living outside of St. Joseph County may wish to assist with one of our mobile pantries in their home county.
- Please have interested parties contact me directly for more information on our Elkhart County mobile pantries, as dates and locations vary weekly.

These are just a few of our ongoing projects! We would be more than happy to take on any or all volunteers at this time. Feel free to contact me at any time with questions or concerns via email or phone.

Please be advised that **closed-toed shoes are mandatory** for volunteers. Additionally, **all volunteers must wear a cloth face covering or mask** due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic.
